## INTRODUCTION

1. The appearance of this Volume of the Yearbook coincides with ICCA's Eighth International Congress in New York, 6–9 May 1986. At this Congress, two main subjects will be discussed: (1) Comparative Arbitration Practice and (2) Arbitration and Public Policy. One finds a wealth of information on both subjects in the first ten Volumes of the Yearbook. This Volume continues the tradition.
2. Once again, the reports presented at the Congress will be published by ICCA. *Congress Series no. 3*, dealing with the New York Congress, will come out a few months after the Congress.
3. Arbitration in the Pacific Rim is becoming increasingly important. The Yearbook, therefore, includes in this Volume National Reports on the law and practice of arbitration in Hong Kong and Singapore.
4. National Reports on the law and practice of arbitration can also be found in the Yearbook's companion publication, ICCA's *International Handbook on Commercial Arbitration*. This publication, under the editorship of Prof. Pieter Sanders, contains National Reports in the same format as those appearing in the Yearbook, and thanks to its loose-leaf format is continuously kept up to date. Moreover, the International Handbook also reproduces the relevant statutes on arbitration.
5. Updatings of National Reports appear in Part IB and new and amended legal texts in Part IV. If the changes in the arbitration law or practice of a country warrant a completely revised National Report in the Yearbook, such Report will appear in Part IA. This Volume contains in Part IB updatings on nine countries; Part IV reports on recent amendments in the arbitration laws of Belgium, Saudi Arabia and Switzerland.
6. As is the case in the previous Volumes of the Yearbook, this Yearbook contains a broad selection of arbitral awards of general interest. The sheer number of awards published in the eleven Volumes and the wide variety of subject matters dealt with in them made it necessary to provide an Index of arbitral awards. The Index, appearing in this Volume for the first time, will be continued in a cumulative form in future Volumes. By providing the Index, it is hoped to make the awards more easily accessible to the Yearbook's readers.

7. This Volume further contains the usual items: Court Decisions on Arbitration (Part IIB), Arbitration Rules (Part IIIA) and the Iran–U.S. Claims Tribunal (Part IIIB).

8. An important development in the international unification of arbitration laws took place in June 1985: the United Nations Commission on International Trade Law (UNCITRAL) adopted a Model Law on International Commercial Arbitration. The full text of the Model Law is reproduced in Part IV.

9. The monitoring of court decisions on the New York Convention of 1958 in Part V of the Yearbook, as of Volume I (1976), continues. Its purpose is to promote the unification of judicial interpretations of the Convention. This year there are 33 decisions reported, bringing the total of decisions to 288 from 22 Contracting States. They are reviewed and commented upon in the Commentary which includes cumulative indexes of the decisions and Commentaries in the previous Volumes.

10. I wish to thank, in particular, Ms. Judy Freedberg of the Arbitration Section of the Asser Institute for her invaluable assistance. My thanks go also to Ms. Pauline Ijdo, whose assistance is made available for the Yearbook by my law firm, for her extensive support, especially, for the Index of awards. I am also grateful to Dott. Silvia van den Muijsenbergh-Borelli for her assistance in preparing extracts of arbitral awards and courts decisions. Ms. Frances Meadows' kind help in translating awards and decisions from French into English is acknowledged with gratitude. A special word of warm thanks goes to my secretary, Ms. Ellen Meijkamp, who sacrificed so many evenings and weekends for word-processing the several thousands of pages of the manuscript.

11. The work for the Yearbook has truly become teamwork. The Yearbook team is as of last year advised by an Editorial Board of icca, composed of Prof. Pieter Sanders, chairman (Netherlands), Mr. Robert Coulson (U.S.A.), Dr. Mauro Ferrante (Italy), Mr. Narayanaswami Krishnamurthi (India), Prof. Pierre Lalive (Switzerland), Dr. Werner Melis (Austria), Prof. Tudor R. Popescu (Romania), Prof. Zhivko Stalev (Bulgaria), Prof. Dr. Ivan Szász (Hungary), Dr. C. C. A. Voskuil (T.M.C. Asser Institute), and the undersigned. The Editorial Board, whose advice is gratefully acknowledged, ensures a broad spectrum of reporting on international commercial arbitration.

12. Yet, above all, the Yearbook cannot function without its readers in more than 100 countries around the world. The Yearbook principally relies on their reporting of new developments in the field of arbitration by sending texts concerning recent changes in arbitration laws, arbitral awards

(the confidentiality of which is ensured) and court decisions of general interest and, in particular, on the New York Convention of 1958. We are greatly indebted to those readers who sent materials for this Volume. Their names are acknowledged in the appropriate Parts of this Volume.

13. Finally, it is a great honour for me to succeed Prof. Pieter Sanders as General Editor as of this year. Without him, the Yearbook would not be the unique source of information on commercial arbitration worldwide. His continuing support in the preparation of this Volume was highly appreciated by all those involved in that task.
